Domestic abuse, also known as intimate partner violence, is a pattern of controlling behaviors including:

- Physical Assaults
- Sexual Assaults
- Emotional Abuse
- Verbal Abuse
- Social Isolation
- Isolation from Support Systems
- Misusing Technology
- Minimizing and Blaming
- Controlling Family Income
- Using Children
- Using Coercion and Threats
- Using Intimidation
- Surveillance/Stalking Behaviors
