# **CHILDREN'S LEARNING CENTER (CLC)**

Children's Learning Center (CLC) is a fully licensed facility offering quality educational programming for children ages 2% to 10.

## **SERVICES OFFERED:**

Full and half-day preschool • School-age programming Preschool/school-age summer sessions • Field trips Limited transportation for school-age children

# **FULL AND HALF-DAY PRESCHOOL**

Our preschool program offers comprehensive, quality programming for children ages 2½ to 5. Staff members are certified and/or highly qualified and trained in the field of early childhood. Daily lesson plans emphasize: Kindergarten readiness skills, pre-literacy and pre-numeracy skills, social/ emotional development, outdoor play, art and music/movement.

# SCHOOL-AGE PROGRAMMING

Available for school-age children, this program identifies and develops individual children's skills and interests, while fostering group cooperation and social skills. The daily range of activities covers all school-age interest areas. From September to June, it is a before and after school service. During the summer months, this service increases to a full-time program.

# PRESCHOOL/SCHOOL-AGE SUMMER SESSIONS

Children's Learning Center offers year-round programming for both preschool and school-age children. The preschool summer program follows the same schedule as during the school year and includes: bike days, water-fun days and outdoor discovery.

The school-age summer program is for children who have completed Kindergarten and offers: field trips, outdoor play and learning experiences, arts/crafts, music/movement and service learning projects.

#### **CLC REGISTRATION INFORMATION:**

- Provides services to children ages 21/2 to 10
- Provides full and part-time programming
- Consistent, set scheduling is required for enrollment
- Offers a 10% discount for additional children in a family
- Partners with the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Little Traverse Bay Bands and Great Start Collaborative Scholarships
- Enrollments are accepted throughout the year

- Classes are tuition-free or reduced tuition; participants must meet eligibility requirements
