WHAT IS DOMESTIC ABUSE?

Domestic abuse is a cultural problem in our society that is rooted in sexism, oppression of women and gender inequality. On an individual level it is an intentional pattern of behaviors used to maintain control in an intimate partner relationship, such as:

- Physical abuse
- Sexual assault
- Emotional abuse
- Verbal abuse
- Social isolation
- Isolation from support systems
- Misusing technology
- Minimizing and blaming
- Controlling family income
- Using children
- Using coercion and threats
- Using intimidation
- Surveillance/stalking behaviors
- Human trafficking

WHAT IS THE DOMESTIC ABUSE PROGRAM?

Confidential, non-judgmental support services and a safe space to engage and connect so survivors can regain control of their lives. We believe all people have a right to a life free of violence. You do not deserve to be hurt; the abuse is not your fault!

Women's Resource Center of Northern Michigan (WRCNM) serves community members in Antrim, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Emmet and Otsego counties. Whether you need a safe place to stay temporarily or are seeking individual support, WRCNM services are available at no cost. Counselors assist with medical, housing, legal and financial advocacy. These broad-based services are available at any point in your life journey.
