#### **OUR NEW FACILITY**

At our new facility, WRCNM will offer:

- Continued and expanded children's education programs for ages 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 5
- Wraparound support for child survivors
- Advocacy and licensed therapy in one location
- Expanded violence prevention and outreach activities
- Collaborative space for community partners
- Barrier-free accesibility

WRCNM satelite offices will continue to provide services in Cheboygan, Otsego, and Antrim counties.

The Safe Home will remain a secure, compassionate place for survivors and their families to stay when their home is no longer safe.

Educational and Employment Services will remain accessible to students on the North Central Michigan College campus.

WRCNM has a reputation for responsible and effective fiscal management of a multi-million dollar budget. Agency policies and funder compliance requirements guide procedures and activities.

Our annual budget is funded through a diverse range of sources that include, but are not limited to:
